Galapagos Park Rules

ACTIVITY GUIDELINES

- 1. Begin by discussing the idea that tourists themselves have a responsibility to behave in a certain way or to spend their money ethically.
- 2. In groups of two or three students can pick a Galapagos Island National Park rule at random and perform a thirty second mime.
- 3. Peers can guess try and guess the rule being mimed, note it down and give suggestions as to why it is needed. All students can then try to put the rules in an order of importance and justify this order by giving verbal feedback.







Visitors cannot take part in any motorised water sports.

Visitors should make every effort to ensure they are travelling with an authorised tourism operator.

Visitors must be accompanied by a guide when visiting protected sites.

Visitors cannot take part in any motorised water sports.

Visitors should stay on the designated trails at all times.

Visitors should keep at least two metres between themselves and any animals.



Visitors should not use flash photography around animals.

Visitors should not feed the wildlife.

Visitors cannot fish from tour boats.

Visitors cannot take part in any motorised water sports.

Visitors should only camp in authorised camp sites.

Visitors should not bring any plants or animals to the Islands and foods are also restricted.



Visitors should not smoke anywhere in the National Park

Visitors should not take shells, rocks, animal parts or native vegetation from the islands as souvenirs.

Visitors should not undertake any acts of vandalism or graffiti.

Visitors should keep any litter until they can deposit it safely.
